## Will it be Noisy or Loud?

The camera is quiet but every time we press the button to take a photograph the lights give a little beep. On some photoshoots we play music to relax you or create a fun atmosphere. 




## Will it be too Bright

#### Where do I Stand


You will stand in front of the camera with the big light in front of you and the background and two smaller lights behind you.
